

Let's discuss... Keeping Safe in the Real World

INTRODUCING THE TOPIC...	There are a number of fairly simple and straightforward things you can do to help keep your young person safe in the real world and on a daily basis
THINGS TO TALK ABOUT...	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Concerns you have for their safety. Whilst you want them to have fun and develop independence, preventing unnecessary risks. - Despite known risks, young people are safer having a phone. They can then be contacted or contact you when they are out and about. Make sure the phone is charged and that it has credit - Use a contract phone rather than pay as you go. This allows a record to be kept of who is contacting the phone. - If a young person is going out, establish where they are, who they are with, and agree a time to be back. - Make a plan for getting home. Make sure they have enough money to follow this plan. - Agree to discuss with another parent/carer if your young person is staying out for the night at their house
