

STEP 1

Your results

The results for all courses completed during 2024/25 will be available on Thursday 21 August. We will use these to produce an enrolment form for you.



STEP 2

Attend your Enrolment Appointment

- Your appointment details are in your enrolment letter.
- All enrolment is taking place in our University Road Buildings.
- On arrival, go to the Study Centre (in the main building) to collect your enrolment form
- You will then be directed to your Enrolment Team and allocated an Enrolment Advisor; you will spend time discussing your results, possible course choices and deciding which subjects to visit for further advice and course confirmation.
- Speak to Subject Specialist staff to gain the information you need to finalise your decisions.
- Return to your Enrolment Advisor to agree your WQE Study Programme.



STEP 3

Attend Orientation

Monday 1, Tuesday 2 or Wednesday 3 September

We are extremely pleased to offer a new, outstanding course during Orientation. This session will support the development of broader skills and confidence to help prepare you for a successful start to your WQE study programme



Talk About Communication is a fast-paced and engaging confident communication workshop that develops students' oracy skills and spoken confidence.

Workshop Aims

- Providing the tools to structure talks and essays
- Practising impromptu speaking
- Expressing ideas and keeping to the point

Orientation will also include a welcome to WQE from the College Principal and Heads of Studies, an opportunity to visit Freshers' Fair and you will collect your WQE ID card ready for the start of teaching.

STEP 4

Securing your place

Entry requirements

As you know, your place at WQE is conditional on your GCSE results. The table below will help you identify the level and programme for which your GCSE grades will enable you to enrol.

Programme	Duration	Entering with
A level and Vocational Level 3	2 years	Six GCSEs grade 9 – 4 including English Language (must include at least two GCSEs at 5 above for A level courses)
Advanced Transition GCSE and Vocational Level 2	1 transition year, with up to 2 further years at advanced level	At least two grade 4s and three grade 3s including English Language
Progression Support	The College offers a small range of bespoke and ESOL provision to enable advanced level progression. For more information about this and the assessment process, please contact the Admissions Team directly	

In addition to these general criteria most courses have specific entry requirements, these are outlined on our website: www.wqe.ac.uk/our-courses

Your WQE Programme

All students are usually required to have a full-time programme comprising a certain amount of contact time or number of lessons per week. A typical timetable will normally include **one** of the following:

- Three A-levels (or equivalent), Enrichment and time with your Personal ProgressMentor.
- Five GCSEs (or equivalent), Higher Project Qualification, Study Skills and time with your Personal Progress Mentor.
- Employability, English, Maths, ICT, Study Skills, Enrichment and time with your Personal Progress Mentor.
- Entry Level/ESOL English, Maths, ICT, Study Skills, Enrichment and time with your Personal Progress Mentor.

Enrichment

Enrichment at WQE gives you the opportunity to enjoy learning something new, meet new people and do something just for fun. For Level 3, Level 1 and Entry Level students, it's one session a week in addition to your main programme.

The enrichment programme has been designed to closely meet the needs of students. The programme allows you to choose a 'theme' for your enrichment that may be linked to your academic programme, progression plans or personal interests.

Your response to the Enrichment Selection Form questionnaire has been recorded. Your Enrolment Advisor will finalise your preferences with you as part of your programme discussion.
