

BIOLOGY, CHEMISTRY AND APPLIED SCIENCE

Practical skills sessions: A mixture of demonstrations and hands-on practicals, linking to the Level 3 Science Courses.

BUSINESS, ECONOMICS AND FINANCE

Branding in Business: A hands-on session looking at branding and market segmentation in real businesses.

What would you do?: A hands-on session looking at real life economic examples faced by governments.

ENGLISH, FILM AND MODERN LANGUAGES

Exploding a Poem: Exploring a Jacob Sam-La Rose poem using the different approaches offered by language and literary study.

Analysing Film: Looking at the narrative and formal properties associated with a short film, to think about and explore how we analyse film at A-level.

Using French film to explore modern families in France: Explore the Family topic to bridge GCSE and A-Level, building vocabulary through familiar tasks and using a comedy film extract to introduce more complex themes such as adoption, diversity and stereotypes.

Explore German: A creative language activity using words, stories and film.

Using Spanish to describe, talk about and explore your family: A series of short activities using the skills of speaking, reading, listening and writing to explore modern families here and in Spanish-speaking countries.

HEALTH AND SPORT

A&E Triage: A hands-on healthcare simulation activity: prioritising patients, selecting appropriate NHS services, and deciding which professionals should help. The activity builds understanding of how the NHS works and highlights the importance of quick, informed decision-making in patient care.

Current Issues in the Sporting World: How does the sociological, psychological and physiological theory you learn about in the classroom apply to the current sporting world? How does this then impact on careers in sport?

HUMANITIES

Ancient History, Geography, History, Law, Politics: An opportunity to meet subject specialists and take part in activities that introduce the skills and topics studied at A-level.

MATHEMATICS

Sequences – The Next Term: An opportunity to speak with subject specialists and see how your work at GCSE will develop at A-level.

MEDIA AND CREATIVE ARTS

Sketchbook Masterclasses for Art & Design, Fashion & Textiles, Fine Art, Graphic Communication, Photography, Product Design: Look through our beautiful sketchbooks and learn valuable tips and techniques to help you produce your own dynamic, exciting and personal sketchbooks for your own work.

Lights, Camera, Analysis: A-Level and BTEC Media at Level 3 at WQE: Short 15-minute talks comparing BTEC Creative Media and OCR A-level Media Studies, highlighting the BTEC's hands-on, technical focus on behind-the-camera video production, and the A-level's emphasis on media analysis alongside a broad range of creative skills including graphic design, radio, music videos and web design.

Radically Reinterpreting Script – An A-Level Approach: An Introduction to A-level Drama & Theatre studies where students will look at radical ways to reinterpret scripts in new and exciting ways.

4-part Chorale: Students will learn how to harmonise a soprano line using alto, tenor and bass parts.

PHYSICS, ELECTRONICS, COMPUTING AND ICT

Introduction to A-Level Computer Science and Level 3 Computing: Meet subject specialists and take part in engaging activities, designed to introduce the key skills and topics covered in our A-level and Level 3 AAQ courses.

Build a binary counter: An opportunity to explore electronics and careers in the field, alongside a hands-on practical activity building a binary counter to illuminate LEDs.

CD hovercrafts to investigate momentum: Use of a leafblower life size hovercraft that can hold a student, followed by CD hovercraft activity to investigate 3 scenarios of momentum.

An introduction to crime and deviance: A range of short activities to help you learn about crime and deviance linked to real crimes.

A psychological taste test!: A variety of short activities to introduce you to the theory and skills of A-level Psychology.
