Task: 3D Design

Welcome to 3D Design. I hope you are ready for a diverse, creative, exciting and productive experience over the next two years. To kick things off, we have set the following task, which must be completed for, and brought to your first Design lesson.

To be done on A3 paper: Landscape format:

Go into your kitchen at home– find what you think is an example of interesting product design (sometimes the small things are the most interesting). You need to fully describe this object through drawing and identify your thinking and reasons for choosing it. You need to use multiple drawings from a range of viewpoints. Use orthographic and isometric 3D views. You may need to zoom in on specific details. You will need to consider how large you draw, how you lay out the sheet, whether to use colour.

Look at examples of product design drawing sheets to guide you on presentation.
